As you all know we are in the middle of another Hurricane Season now. So far so good but as this newsletter is being compiled were tracking a storm in the Caribbean. Please be sure to look over your plans in case one of these nasty storms decides to come our way. Don't wait for the last minute! Be prepared now! Are you staying or leaving? If leaving get out early, if your plans include haling your horses remember our traffic get worse the closer to land fall the storm gets.



Be sure to have enough hay and feed to last for at least 2 Weeks. Have Barrels of water ready. Be sure to mark your horses with ID. Have a medical Kit ready and well stocked. Does your property have any trees that need to be trimmed? Do tree trimming now not later. Do a full check of your barn. How is your roof? If you turn your horses out check all your fencing to be sure it is in good shape.

Remember last year Hurricane Katrina or even closer to home Hurricane Charlie in 2004? These two events are a good reminder of how Mother Nature can be and what we need to do to be prepared for here in The Sunshine State of Florida!
